This free program is open to those who are 65 years of age or older and live alone or are left alone for extended periods of time on a regular basis; or for people with a medical condition(s) that could lead to incapacitation and who live alone or who are alone for extended periods of time on a regular basis.

*Please note age ranges may differ due to exigent circumstances that may apply.

The program consists of a lockbox, which will be owned and maintained by the Police Department, which will be placed on the participant's property by Police personnel. The lockbox will contain a key to the residence (which the resident must supply). The key will only be accessed by responding police officers in the event of an emergency where officers cannot access the residence. The lockbox code will only be given to Police personnel. The resident will not know or have access to the lockbox code. The Operation Blue Angel program lockbox will not be accessed for lock-outs or any other non-emergent situation.

The Pinole Police Department is happy to announce the availability of the Operation Blue Angel program for Pinole residents. *Please note age ranges may differ due to exigent circumstances that may apply.

The lockbox will contain a key to the residence (which the resident must supply). However, emergency personnel will use their best efforts to utilize the lock box when time permits and the situation permits.

WestCAT to Provide Free Bus Rides on Weekday Spare the Air Days in 2020

PINOLE, CA, January 9, 2020 – Starting January 1, 2020, all official weekday "Spare the Air" days announced by the Bay Area Air Quality Management District, will be FREE FARE days on WestCAT buses. Anyone riding on WestCAT fixed route buses on one of these days can ride for FREE, including the popular Lynx Transbay service.

"We've provided free rides on Spare the Air days in the past with great success and increased ridership," said WestCAT General Manager, Charles Anderson. "We're excited about having the opportunity to offer this again throughout 2020."

Funding for the program is limited and free rides will be offered only while funding remains. However, it is estimated that approximately 30 Spare the Air days will be able to be funded in 2020. "If we run out of funds before the end of 2020, we'll have to stop the program," said Anderson. "But if funds remain, we will continue offering free rides on Spare the Air days into 2021 until all funds are expended."

The free rides are being paid for with funds received by the Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP); one of several programs that are part of the Transit, Affordable Housing, and Sustainable Communities Program. The LCTOP was created to provide operating and capital assistance for transit agencies to reduce greenhouse gas emission and improve mobility, with a priority on serving disadvantaged communities. Approved projects all have a goal of reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

One of the most effective ways residents can help protect the climate and improve air quality is to make every day clean air choices like driving less and riding transit. WestCAT's Spare the Air Free Ride incentive provides the public an opportunity to try transit and decrease their dependence on cars, which remain the Bay Area's number one source of air pollution. "By riding WestCAT buses on Spare the Air days, you'll be doing your part to reduce smog when air quality is expected to be unhealthy," said Anderson. "It's also a great opportunity to try using the bus to get to work, school, BART or anywhere WestCAT goes, for free."

The Spare the Air Free Fare program will be provided on WestCAT fixed route buses only, including Lynx Transbay Service. Free rides will not be provided on Paratransit/Dial-A-Ride. WestCAT is the local public transit provider in Western Contra Costa County providing local, express and regional bus service to the cities of Pinole and Hercules, and the unincorporated communities of Montalvin Manor, Tara Hills, Bayview, Rodeo, Crockett, and Port Costa. WestCAT operates regional service from the Hercules Transit Center to Martinez and Contra Costa College and Lynx Transbay service to the San Francisco Transbay Terminal.
