CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) UPDATE

In response to the COVID-19 epidemic and the County health orders, the City of Pinole has modified its operations and services, effective March 17, 2020 through at least May 31, 2020. Some highlights are listed below. You can find more complete information on the City's COVID-19 website:

• Bay Area Health Officers issued a new Health Order which reopens all retail to storefront pick-up and associated manufacturing and logistics.

This move was possible since data in Contra Costa shows that hospitalizations have been declining over the past few weeks and the number of new cases has been flat, even with a substantial increase in testing. Our personal responsibility to follow health officials' recommendations dealing with hygiene, physical distancing, face covering and monitoring our symptoms will determine how successful we will be in moving through this re-opening without a resurgence of expanding transmission and increasing hospitalizations. CENSUS 2020! IT'S TIME TO RESPOND!

There's no denying we are living in unnerving and uncertain times as we respond to the COVID-19 pandemic. That's why it's more important than ever that everyone respond to Census 2020. In fact, how we respond to this Census will impact our ability to respond to future public health crises like the one we are living through right now. Thankfully, the Census is a social distancing approved activity and it has never been easier to respond in the comfort and safety of your own home.

By now, all households should have received a notification in the mail inviting them to respond to the census. You can fill out the census online at my2020census.gov, by phone (numbers available in 13 languages at this link), or by mail. Starting Mid-May, the Census Bureau will begin sending out Enumerators to follow up with households who haven't responded.

Make sure to count **everyone** living in your household as of April 1, 2020. Remember, your responses are confidential and will shape how much federal funding and civic representation

our Pinole gets <u>for the next decade</u>. When you've completed your census post a picture on your social media with your receipt and tag #CountMeIn and #CoCoCounts.
