PINOLE WEBSITE – REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS (RFP)

Per the City Council's direction, a Request for Proposal (RFP) for redesign of the City's Website will be released on Friday March 10th. The deadline to submit proposals is set for April 20, 2017. The RFP will be posted on the City's website and will also be mailed to a number of companies. Selection of a vendor is anticipated in June 2017.

<u>NEOGOV ONLINE ONLINE RECRUITMENT PROGRAM</u>

In the FY 2016-17 budget the City Council approved participation in NEOGOV, an online recruitment and job application program. Staff is currently in the implementation stage, setting up the software for production use. Once the software is "live", all of our job postings will be hosted on NEOGOV, candidates will submit applications online, and communications with candidates will be via e-mail. This will result in increased efficiencies in our recruitment processes. The software is tentatively scheduled to be online by late April.

• RECREATION SOFTWARE (RECDESK) IMPLEMENTATION

The Recreation Department currently uses a software system called "CLASS" to register children in our recreation programs, as well as to track program registrants and revenues at the Senior Center. A year ago, we were notified that this program would no longer be supported by the company.

The City Council approved the purchase of a new software system called "RecDesk". Staff has purchased the software with training to be provided on setting up the software for use. The software is scheduled to go live on July 1, 2017.
